### Dues Deductibility

For federal income tax purposes, payments to the AIA and its components are not deductible as charitable deductions, but are generally deductible as trade or business expenses, except for the percentage expended on lobbying federal or state governments. Accordingly a percentage of your national and state individual and supplemental dues is deductible on federal income tax forms. The tax-deductible percentage of dues is National: 91.1%, State 66.9%; Local 100%.

The \$30 subscription cost of *Architectural Record* is included in your annual dues. This statement is made for auditing purposes only. Subscription costs are not deductible from membership dues.
